

February Presentation: Brad Karoleff

“Connections; Black Pepper, The Mountain That Eats Men and John Reich.”

Brad Karoleff has been president of the John Reich Collectors Society and editor of their JR Journal for many years. He is co-owner of the Coins Plus coin shop in Cincinnati, Ohio, since 1981, and PNG member after 2009.

The John Reich Collectors Society is devoted to the study of United States gold and silver coinage issued between 1792 and introduction of the seated liberty design. John Reich was the designer for dies used on various series such as the Capped Bust type half dollar of 1807 to 1836.



Karoleff compiled *Bust Half Dollar Bibliomania*, an annotated guide to the literature pertaining to the Capped Bust Half Dollar Series. He has been a columnist for *Coin World* magazine. He was honored by the American Numismatic Association with the Glenn Smedley Award in 2007 and as the Harry J. Foreman Dealer of the Year for 2013. He is married to Michelle with two children.
